

I am asking you, please, to cast your ccTLD's vote to return NIGEL ROBERTS to a second term on the ICANN Board of Directors and wish to express my thanks to Souleymane Oumtanaga of .CI (Cote d'Ivoire) for proposing me and to my three seconders.

Whilst at the time of writing this I am only half-way through my first term as a Member of the Board, I have already achieved much.

Since joining the Board of ICANN as one of its Directors at the end of October, 2018, I have undertaken all five courses of the Institute of Directors which comprise the Role of the Director, Finance, Leadership, Strategy, and Developing Board Performance, following which I was awarded the grade of Fellow of the Institute of Directors.

I have served effectively on the Board since 2018, serving as a member of the Audit Committee, the Risk Committee, as well the Board Accountability Mechanisms Committee.

I have demonstrated a continuous commitment, over two decades, to the success of ICANN, ccTLDs and the multi-stakeholder model. I have been involved in networking and Internet technologies since 1978 and in 1997 I was a participant in the original gTLD Memorandum of Understanding, and took an active part in the International Forum on the White Paper (IFWP) which led directly to the creation of ICANN and the multistakeholder model for the DNS. I was elected to the first ICANN DNSO Council representing ccTLDs in 1998.

Between 2001-2002 I was on the Administrative Committee (AdCom) of wwTLD - the organisation that represented ccTLDs before the formation of the ccNSO. I have served as a ccNSO Council Member for 4 years and on the ICANN Ethos Award Panel for two years.

I have a technical background in Computer Science and engineering. I was awarded Fellowship of the British Computer Society (the Chartered Institute for IT) in 2005 and of the Royal Society of Arts in 2016 . I also have a qualifying law degree (LLB).

I am employed as a Director of Island Networks and Island Networks (Jersey), the ccTLD managers for Guernsey and Jersey respectively.

I also have other experience of serving as a Director of non-profit sector boards as well as commercial enterprises: between 1991 - 1996 I was a Board member of the Radio Society of Great Britain, a national representative organisation with a thriving technical book publishing business.

I am asking for you to give me your support again, please, in order to continue the task I began for you in October 2018.
