

## **Incident Repository Implementation Working Group Call** *21 September 2011*

- The group discussed the Asia Pacific Repository-Relationship Document composed by Hitoshi Saito and decided to use it as a base for a general relationship overview, including all regions.

Initially, following changes/additions were set to the existing overview in order to make it more general:

- Use cases should be reflected in the diagram
- CERTS should be listed
- Arrows should run between entities to clarify relationships
- List example ccTLD's from each region
- Include links to relevant organisations

It was decided that all Working Group members should review the document based on the relationship systems in their own regions in order to better succeed in making it applicable to all regions.

Bart Boswinkel offered to summarise the tasks in an email to the group.

- The group discussed the financial aspects of building versus buying the contact repository and decided that this should be an early focus point whilst the funding issue should be raised at a latter point.
- The group decided that a list must be made to specify the requirements of the contact repository. It was further decided to review the requirements listed by the Incident Response Working Group and if needed build on that list.

Bart offered to share a graphic overview to help the process of developing the requirements.

Bart suggested to the group that the repository could be run in the same fashion as a registry, on a basic level.

- Isak Jacobsen reported that he presented the idea of a Nordic Repository at a regional meeting, however the Nordic ccTLD's felt that a general repository would be enough and an additional local system would be too difficult to maintain.
